

HEALTH, SAFETY, AND ENVIRONMENT (HSE) ADVISOR

General Scope of Position

An Alberta based oilfield service company is currently seeking to hire a HSE professional into a Field Advisor role. This is a seasonal, rotation based position, compensation will be based on a combination of qualifications, training and experience. The position will be based from remote field site locations. The selected candidate must be a problem-solving leader whom is willing to take on an elevated level of responsibility while maintaining confidentiality and professionalism. The HSE ADVISOR is responsible to report directly to the HSE Manager and the Senior Management Team. The HSE ADVISOR must be a person who is central to ensuring operations are being conducted in compliance with all applicable regulations as well as company and client safety standards.

Qualification, Skills and Experience Expectations

- 5 or more years in a safety role where the scope of work was 80% or more dedicated to HSE
- Minimum high school education with proof of continued professional education
- A professional occupational health and safety designation from an accredited institution
- A solid understanding of HSE Management Systems
- Previous oilfield service company experience within the oil and gas industry would be an asset
- Ability to demonstrate a solid understanding of Microsoft Office, Outlook, Data base software and general computer related operations
- Knowledge of Government OH&S Regulations, Workers Compensation, National Safety Code, Employment Standards and Human Rights
- The candidate must be a team player with excellent communication skills, they must be able to identify areas of improvement and influence company culture through training and a hands-on attitude
- Personal and professional integrity must be upheld throughout all company decisions

Essential Functions

- Review and approve weekly inspection requirements as based on the company's inspection matrix.
- Review and verify crews daily reporting is accurate and consistent with company expectations.
- Review, update, develop, and implement procedures, process, plans, and policies that will assist in the prevention of personnel and corporate loss.
- Provide guidance for crew compliance in regards to occupational health and safety, workers compensation board, transportation of dangerous goods, national safety code, transport Canada, industry best practices, client and company requirements.
- Enforce company progressive disciplinary standards for HSE non-compliance related events brought to senior management's attention
- Assist in the management of all workers compensation board events.
- Lead or participate in incident investigations.
- Attend and actively participate in safety and operations meetings.
- Conduct weekly routine inspection program.
- Keep up to date on new technical developments that could improve the safety management system.
- Collect and analyze crew statistics for trending.
- Monitor company internal vehicle monitoring system for all crew activity.
